CEO of HBGary Federal, a services company focused on delivering specialized threat intelligence, incident response, and information operations capabilities to the IC, DoD, and Federal agencies.

Previously served as the Director of Technology for the Cybersecurity and SIGINT Business Unit within Northrop Grummans Intelligence Systems Division, and as the Chief Engineer for Northrop Grummans's Cyber Campaign.

As Technical Director, I was responsible for developing technical strategies and roadmaps for a \$750 million organization as well as managing approximately \$20 million in Research and Development projects. Prior to joining Northrop Grumman, I served 12 years in the United States Navy as an enlisted cryptologist, senior signals analyst, software programmer, and system administrator. I served tours in Misawa, Japan, Norfolk Virginia, Pensacola Florida, and Rota Spain. While serving in Norfolk Virginia, I was accepted into the Enlisted Education Advancement Program (EEAP) where I finished a Bachelors of Science in Biology, minoring in Chemistry, later completing a Masters in Computer Science with an emphasis in Computer Security. I have been a panelist and given speeches on cybersecurity, social media, and emerging technologies at numerous Intelligence Community and DoD conferences and symposiums.

Vicky Cox, an administrative person with a ugov, rather than DNI email address, sent Aaron Barr the following bio on Dr. Lisa J. Porter, the first director of IARPA – the Intelligence Advanced Research Projects Activity.

This arrived 25 August 2010 and the meeting was set for 10 September 2010.

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Dr. Lisa Porter joined the Office of the Director of National Intelligence as the first director of the Intelligence Advanced Research Projects Activity (IARPA) on February 4, 2008.

Dr. Porter came to IARPA following service as the NASA associate administrator for the Aeronautics Research Mission Directorate. In this position, she managed the agency's aeronautics research portfolio and guided its strategic direction. Dr. Porter also co-chaired the National Science & Technology Council's Aeronautics Science & Technology Subcommittee and helped to lead the development of the nation's first Presidential Aeronautics R&D Policy.

Prior to her time at NASA, Dr. Porter served as a senior scientist in the Advanced Technology Office of the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA). While there, she created and managed programs in diverse technical areas ranging from fundamental scientific research to multi-disciplinary systems-level development and integration efforts.

Dr. Porter has a bachelor's degree in nuclear engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a doctorate in applied physics from Stanford University. She has authored more than 25 publications in a broad range of technical disciplines including nuclear engineering, solar physics, plasma physics, computational materials modeling, explosives detection, and vibration control of flexible structures.

Dr. Porter received the Office of the Secretary of Defense Medal for Exceptional Service.

Stephanie Blackwood, an administrative person attached to Lisa Porter, asked Aaron Barr for any read ahead information. Barr responded at 1:56 9 September 2010 with a powerpoint presentation and two PDFs. These are quite instructive and we regret not being able to offer a link to the archive.
